Dear Reader:

As my term on the Clients' Security Board comes to an end in just a few months, I would like to briefly recap my five years of service. The Supreme Judicial Court appointed me effective January 1, 2007. Since then, during my term as a member and the chair (2010-2011) the Board decided 486 claims and made awards totaling \$10,398,154.00 to individuals who were clients of some of the very few dishonest Massachusetts lawyers. But for the Court's unwavering support for the Board's mission to reimburse 100 cents of every dollar misappropriated, claimants would have little if any opportunity to obtain meaningful reimbursement for their financial loss.


Professional liability insurance, which is not mandatory for Massachusetts lawyers, generally does not provide coverage for the intentional tort of misappropriation. A civil suit against the defalcating lawyer, even if it results in a judgment, is of limited use because most often the lawyer is without any meaningful funds. Criminal prosecution and conviction may result in a restitution order that takes effect only after the defendant's incarceration has ended, and even then it usually amounts to only a trickle of usually \$50 to \$100 per month. At this rate it takes in excess of eight years to reimburse a \$10,000 theft. This is not to say that the Board is less than diligent in its reimbursement efforts evidenced by the fact over the last five years we have been successful in recovering in excess of \$1.1 million dollars.

For every year I have been a member except one (2010), Trusts and Estates was the practice area with the largest share of the total annual awards. It regained that position this year with awards of \$861,000 to six claimants. This represented 43% of the total awards made in this fiscal year. Preventing losses in this practice area remains a challenge for the Board.

In December 2010 Roderick L. Ireland took the oath as the thirty-sixth Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court. We are confident that he will continue the rich tradition of his predecessors in lending his personal as well as institutional support to the Board's mission of full restitution to clients whose Massachusetts lawyers misappropriated their money or property. The Board looks forward to working with Chief Justice Ireland.

It has truly been a fulfilling five years and I thank my fellow Board members and our dedicated staff for all their hard work and support.



Board Members

Charles W. Goddard, Esq., Chair, was appointed to the Board on January 1, 2007. He has been a partner in the law firm of Goddard, Scuteri & Delaney in Salem, MA, since 1991 where his practice concentrates on civil litigation in all courts of the Commonwealth. Mr. Goddard has served as President of the Essex County Bar Association (1990-1992); as Conciliator in the Superior Court since 1988; as a member of the Joint Bar Committee on Judicial Nominations (1989-1991); and on the Judicial Nominating Council (1991-1993). He has served as Chairman of the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Manchester (1970-1972) and as Town Counsel, Manchester, MA (1976-1988). 




