Injury Deaths to Massachusetts Adults Ages 25-44 Years

Injuries are the leading cause of death to adults between the ages of 25 and 44 years. In 2010, there were **792** injury deaths to adults ages 25-44, a rate of **45.7** deaths for every 100,000 adults of this age group. Poisoning, which includes drug overdoses, was the leading cause (47%) of injury deaths in this age group.
