CONSENT AGREEMENT FOR REPRIMAND


The Massachusetts Board of Registration of Physician Assistants ("Board") and Jennifer E. Bastis, holder of Physician Assistant ("PA") License No. PA707 ("Licensee"), hereby stipulate and agree that the following information shall be entered into, and become a permanent part of, the Licensee's records that are maintained by the Board:


1. The Board issued to the Licensee a license to practice as a Physician Assistant, License No. PA707, on or about January 8, 1996.
2. The Licensee did not timely renew her PA license before it expired on March 1, 2011.
3. The Licensee acknowledges that following the expiration of her Physician Assistant license on March 1, 2011, she continued, while unlicensed, to practice as a PA under the supervision of Phillip B. Nedelman, M.D., and E. John Lentini, D.O., at Braintree Family Physician, Inc., 382 Grove Street, Braintree, Massachusetts 02184, until on or about August 15, 2011.
4. The Licensee agrees that this Consent Agreement ("Consent Agreement" or "Agreement") is executed in resolution of the complaint identified by Docket No. PA-2011-007 ("Complaint"), which alleges that the Licensee practiced as a Physician Assistant between March 1, 2011 and August 15, 2011, while unlicensed. The Licensee acknowledges that the allegations contained in the Complaint provide sufficient grounds for the Board to take disciplinary action against her Physician Assistant license pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws ("M.G.L.") Chapter 112, section 9I; M.G.L. c. 112, § 61; and Board regulations at 263 Code of Massachusetts Regulations ("CMR") 3.05(2) governing license renewal.
5. In full resolution of the Complaint, and without the necessity of additional proceedings before the Board, the Board hereby imposes, and the Licensee hereby accepts, a REPRIMAND for the Licensee's unlicensed practice as a Physician Assistant. The Licensee understands that a Reprimand constitutes disciplinary action by the Board.
6. The Licensee agrees to return to the Board at its office at 239 Causeway Street, Suite 500, Boston, Massachusetts 02114, either by hand or by mail, the **two (2)** enclosed duplicate originals of this Consent Agreement signed by the Licensee, witnessed and dated, no later than **fourteen (14) days from her receipt of this Agreement.**

7. In consideration of the Licensee's execution of this Consent Agreement and full compliance with its terms, the Board agrees not to pursue any additional action before itself based upon the allegations set forth in the Complaint.
8. The Licensee acknowledges that her decision to enter into this Consent Agreement is a final act and is not subject to reconsideration or judicial review.
9. The Licensee states that she has used legal counsel in connection with her decision to enter into this Consent Agreement or, if she has not used legal counsel, that the decision not to do so has been one taken of her own free will.
10. The Licensee understands that, after its Effective Date, set forth below, this Consent Agreement constitutes a "public record" within the meaning of M.G.L. c. 4, § 7, subject to public disclosure and that the Board may forward a copy of this Agreement to other licensing boards or law enforcement entities, or both, as well as to any other individual or entity as required by law.
11. The Licensee certifies that she has read this document entitled "Consent Agreement for Reprimand." She understands that she has a right to formal adjudication concerning the allegations against her and that during said adjudication she would possess the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses, to call witnesses, to present evidence, to testify on her own behalf, to contest the allegations, to present oral argument, to appeal to the courts, and all other rights as set forth in the Massachusetts Administrative Procedures Act, M.G.L. c. 30A, and the Standard Adjudicatory Rules of Practice and Procedure, 801 CMR 1.01 *et seq.* The Licensee further states that she understands that in executing this document entitled "Consent Agreement for Reprimand", she is knowingly and voluntarily waiving her right to formal adjudication and to all of the related rights listed above.
