AGENCY OVERVIEW

The Massachusetts Office of Business Development (MOBD) is the state's one-stop source for businesses seeking to relocate to Massachusetts and businesses wishing to expand their current operations here.

MOBD offers a range of expertise and services to help business flourish in Massachusetts. MOBD's staff operates regionally statewide, so that the Agency can provide on-the-ground knowledge and viable connections for businesses. MOBD works closely with the private and public sectors to coordinate a range of resources, including financing opportunities, workforce training and site selection.

MOBD oversees and manages the Economic Development Incentive Program (EDIP), a tax incentive program designed to foster full-time job creation and to stimulate business growth across the Commonwealth. Companies eligible for the EDIP program may receive state and local tax incentives in exchange for full-time job creation, manufacturing job retention and private investment commitments.

Tax Incentives. The EDIP is one of our most effective programs for growing business in Massachusetts. EDIP tax credits and other incentives are available to companies that make qualifying investments in new facilities and create new jobs. Since EDIP was reformed and upgraded in late 2009, 252 businesses have committed to creating over 17,716 new jobs, retaining 47,883 jobs, and spending over 6.194 billion in private investments. Of those 252 projects, 134 were manufacturers and 110 projects were in Gateway Cities.

In FY'15, the Economic Coordinating Council (EACC) has approved 55 EDIP projects, of which 28 projects are manufacturers and 20 in Gateway Cities. These projects committed to creating 3,733 new jobs, retaining 7,432 with a private investment of \$779,958,688. In return EDIP awarded \$17,750,441 in investment tax credits ("ITC").

REDO. MOBD provides capacity building grants to regional economic development organizations through the REDO Grant program. In FY2015, MOBD had provided 12 awards to REDOs who strengthened the economic development of their regions. The value of the awards totaled \$650,000.

Dear Governor Baker:

On behalf of the Massachusetts Office of Business Development (MOBD) we are pleased to send you the Economic Development Incentives Program (EDIP) Fiscal Year 2015 Annual Report.

Now in the sixth year since the 2010 program reforms, the EDIP continues to be the largest job creation incentive in the Commonwealth. In fiscal year 2015 fifty-five (55) projects were approved with the potential to create 3,733 jobs, the retention of 7,432 jobs and a private investment of \$780 million. Since the 2010 changes, 252 projects have received approval, leading to the potential creation of 17,716 new jobs, the retention of 47,883 existing jobs and leveraging of over \$6.2 billion in private investment. The EACC has assisted 134 manufacturers through the EDIP and has supported 110 projects in Gateway Cities.






Job Impact* by Region




Fiscal Year 2015 EDIP Projects

FY 2015 Accomplishments



In June 2015 **MASSPIRG** cited the EDIP program in their hearing testimony to the **Joint Committee on Economic Development & Emerging Technology** as a good example of transparency. A quote from their testimony follows:

“Last year the **EDIP** made significant steps forward in providing detailed information, by recipient on not only the award but also the number of jobs promised and created. As a matter of fact, MASSPIRG awarded the state a grade of an A this year in our annual review of state spending websites, for the level and comprehensiveness of state spending transparency. This is a significant improvement from the F award in 2010.”

FY 2015 Accomplishments



- **Annual reporting** was conducted for all 455 active EDIP projects
- EACC decertified 12 EDIP projects and approved the voluntary withdrawal of Certified Project status for 5 projects (total of 17 projects removed from the Program)
- Decertification and withdrawal of certified project status from EDIP ends the tax credits in year found non-compliant and for all future years

FY 2016 Goals & Initiatives



- Implement a “but for these EDIP incentives, jobs and investment would not occur” emphasis vs. the “entitlement” mentality for projects
- Codify changes in the Acts of 2014 into the EDIP regulations
- Hold at least one EACC Board Policy Meeting. Topics to include among others:
 - Review of award schedule and criteria
 - Changes in project after approval: timing, job creation less than commitment, pro-rated EDIPC based on performance
 - Exceptional Opportunities
- Convene team to assess EDIP applications and determine if they can be streamlined
- Finalize information sharing processes with Department of Revenue (DOR) and Division of Unemployment Assistance (DUA)


