

# Memo: Board of Registration of Professional Engineers and of Land Surveyors Releases Updated Draft of Proposed Changes to 250 CMR

**RE: UPDATED VERSION OF PROPOSED CHANGES TO ENGINEER AND LAND SURVEYOR REGULATIONS**

The Board of Registration of Professional Engineers and of Land Surveyors (“the Board”) is posting an updated version of proposed changes to its regulations, which are found in Title 250 of the Code of Massachusetts Regulations (“250 CMR”). The Board’s regulations set the standards for the practice of engineering and land surveying throughout the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The Board first posted its proposed regulations on June 6, 2013. Since that time, the Board has made structural changes to the organization of the proposed regulations to incorporate feedback received from the Secretary of the Commonwealth’s office. These changes consisted of combining certain sections of the proposed regulations and re-wording section titles to reflect the combination of sections. The content of the proposed regulations, however, has not changed. The Board is now posting its UPDATED DRAFT version of the proposed regulations and seeking feedback from the public at this time.

The Board invites all interested parties to review the proposed regulations and submit written comments to the Board.
